HONORS and AWARDS

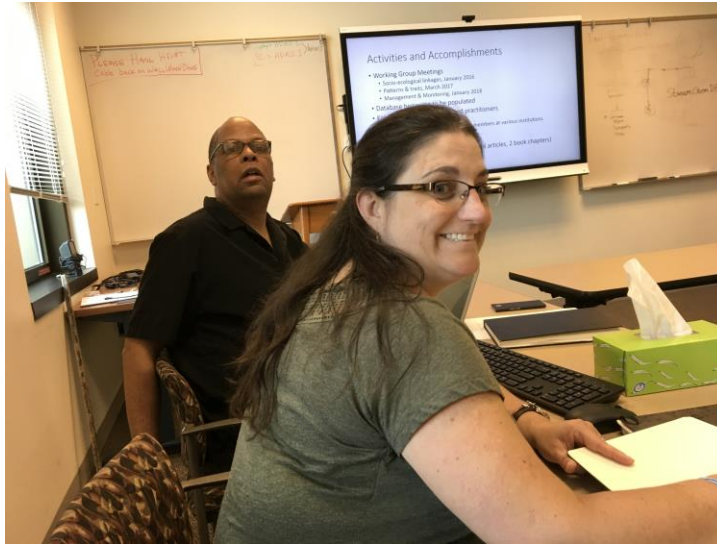

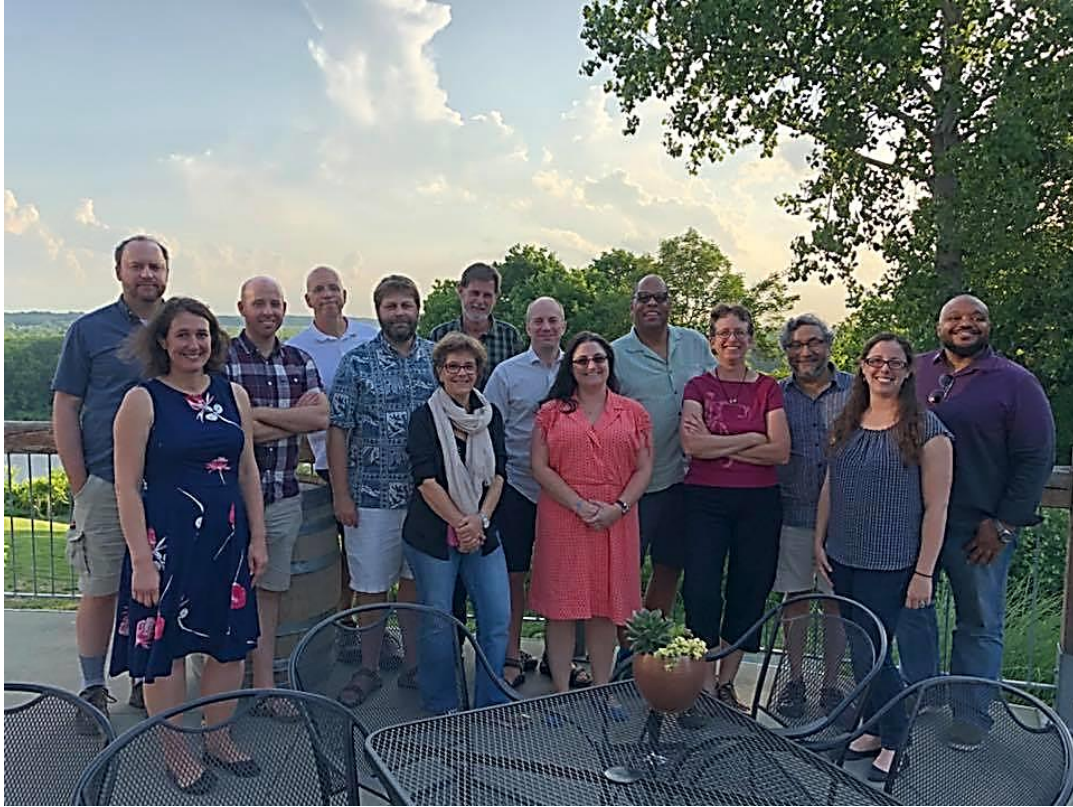

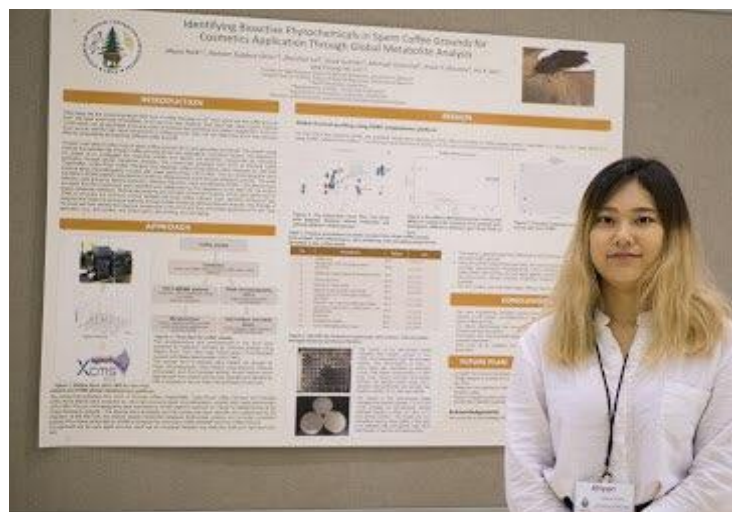
