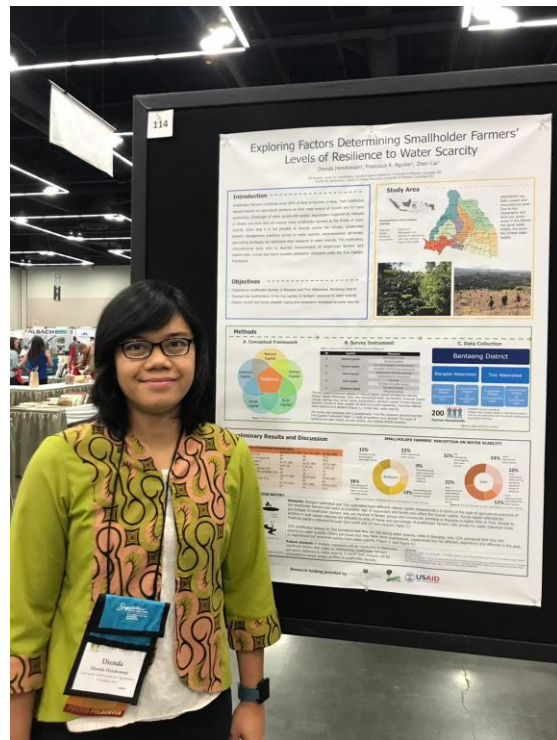
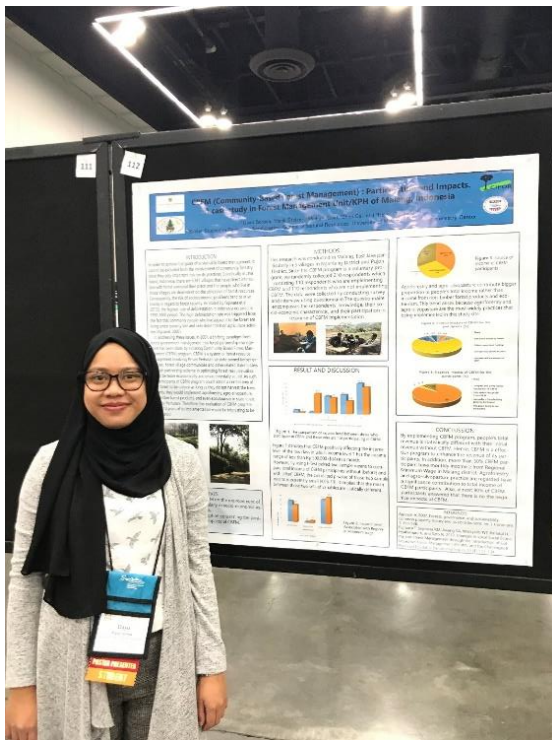

Susan Flader is a University of Missouri professor emerita who has written widely about conservationist Aldo Leopold and on the history of parks and forests in Missouri.

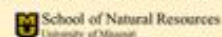
She will be providing commentary and facilitating a discussion about the film and Leopold's influence on conservation in Missouri.

C. Randal “Randy” Vessell, 71, of Blackwater passed away Friday, Oct. 12, 2018, at MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, Texas. Born Charles Randal Vessell on Nov. 20, 1946, in Ironton, Missouri, Randy was the son of Nesta Marie Wade Vessell and the late Adrain Joseph “A.J.” Vessell. He graduated from St. Joseph Catholic High School in Farmington in 1964 and signed a scholarship with the University of Missouri-Rolla (UMR) to play basketball. He was the first of his family to attend college. While playing basketball at UMR, Randy achieved two-time MVP, two-time MIAA All Conference, two-time team captain and three-time leading scorer. He was inducted into the MSM/UMR Athletic Hall of Fame in 1989. Randy earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from UMR in 1969 and a Master’s of Science degree in Recreation & Parks Administration from the University of Missouri-Columbia in 1975. After graduating, Randy volunteered one season as an assistant coach for UMR basketball with his coach, Billy Key, and later continued his interest coaching youth basketball teams at Saints Peter and Paul Catholic School in Boonville for 10 years.
